Since 2002, Life Services Alternatives (LSA) has been providing exceptional community living and programs for adults with developmental disabilities in Santa Clara County. Today, LSA operates 15 licensed residential care homes located in Santa Clara, Campbell, San Jose, and Morgan Hill which house both male and female residents from ages 18 to 82. There is a critical shortage of affordable housing in California for people with developmental disabilities, one of the most vulnerable and economically challenged populations in the state. In Silicon Valley, affordable housing is even harder to come by with lack of availability and a sky-rocketing cost of living.

GET INVOLVED

In 2021, LSA acquired an existing care home that was in danger of closing. Hatikvah House became our fifteenth home. While we have made progress on our mission and goal to open one home every year, it is not enough. The need for housing for developmentally disabled adults in our county is so great that despite a pandemic, we received many more referrals than available vacancies. In order to help alleviate the need for housing for developmentally disabled adults in our county, LSA has purcased our sixteenth home. In 2002, when LSA was founded, we never dreamed of growing to fifteen homes in 20 years. Our fifteen homes located throughout Santa Clara County, from Morgan Hill to Santa Clara, not only provide housing to 90 individuals who live in our homes and attend our programs, but they learn life skills, work with several therapists, including a recreational therapist and a music therapist, expand their social skills, learn job skills, and how to work as a team with their housemates.

LSA offers a Community Integration Training Program (CITP) that benefits our participants as well as other non-profit organizations in our county. The program participants work at libraries, senior centers, churches, food banks, and other places. It is a win-win program for both the participants and the organizations. Our residents grow their job skills, increase their socialization skills, and gain self-esteem knowing they are helping others.
